The last four Stooges episodes featuring Shemp were filmed after he died. The film's producer, Jules White, brought a Shemp double who was only seen from behind.

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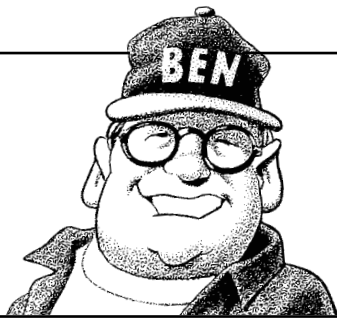
